

## Today's Mass

**First Reading** (Genesis 14:18–20): Melchizedek, referred to here as 'priest of God Most High', brings bread and wine, a prefiguring of the Eucharist. Melchizedek is mentioned in Eucharistic Prayer I and in today's Responsorial **Psalm 110(109)**, in which we are brought to reflect on how Christ, as Son, shares in God's supreme dominion, but exercises His power in priesthood.

**Second Reading** (1 Corinthians 11:23–26): The institution narrative in every Eucharistic Prayer is based on the Gospels but also on this passage – which, written some twenty years after Jesus died, is the earliest testimony to the tradition. The first memorial acclamation is taken from this passage.

The **Sequence** may be said or sung, in its longer or shorter form. St Thomas Aquinas specially composed the Sequence for the new Feast of Corpus Christi in 1264; it emphasises the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

The **Gospel** (Luke 9:11–17) is the feeding of the Five Thousand. Moses had fed the Israelites in the desert (Exodus 16) and Elisha had fed the people with more than enough (2 Kings 4). Jesus also feeds the people, but His miracle exceeds the prophets' miracles. Like all the Gospels, Luke clearly presents this miracle as having eucharistic overtones, as we may discern from the verbs he uses to describe Jesus' actions.

- The Procession is an act of worship. Please join in; do not stand around and take photographs/videos.

## Adoration on Wednesday morning




