Today's Mass

The Pope's Cathedral as the Bishop of Rome is not St Peter's in the Vatican - as many people suppose - but the Archbasilica of St John Lateran in Rome. It is dedicated to the Most Holy Saviour (and both St John the Baptist and St John the Evangelist), and thus the anniversary of its Dedication, as a Feast of Christ, displaces the Sunday of Ordinary Time. The feast's theological importance is that it expresses our communion with the Bishop of Rome, the Pope; it is this communion which makes us Catholic.

On Friday, we celebrated the feast of the Dedication of our Cathedral Church of St George; this feast expresses our communion with the Archbishop of Southwark, and it is this which makes us members of the local church of Southwark.

The Readings at Mass today are taken from the Common of the Dedication of a Church. The First Reading (Ezekiel 47:1-2,8-9,12) is Ezekiel's vision, written during the exile, of the Lord's return to Jerusalem and the restoration of the Temple as a place of healing and refreshment. Psalm 45(46) continues the same idea.

In the Second Reading (1 Corinthians 3:9-11,16-17), St Paul uses a building as an image of the Church community being developed in Corinth, which is God's holy Temple.

Gospel (John 2:13-22): Jesus clears the sellers and money-changers out of the Temple, but speaks of His body as the Temple - although the disciples only understood this later. Jesus Christ - whose Body comes to us in the Mass - has replaced the old Temple in Jerusalem.
