Today's Mass

The **First Reading** (Zephaniah 2:3;3:12-13) is a sort of pre-echo of the Beatitudes in today's Gospel. God's people are to show humility, seek righteousness, do no injustice, and speak no lies.

Psalm 146(145) describes God's power and goodness. Unusually, the Response (Matthew 5:3) is taken not from the Psalm, but from the Gospel. Did you know that the Responsorial Psalm is so-called not because it has a repeated response in it, but because it is a response to the First Reading?

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 1:26-31): St Paul portrays the message of the Cross as an indictment of the normal public values of wisdom and power, since it reverses worldly standards and undermines human pretensions. All of today's Readings are profoundly countercultural.

Gospel (Matthew 5:1-12a): At the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches the crowd the Beatitudes, surely amongst the best-known and loved of all Scripture passages.

The Beatitudes promise comfort in the next life, which helps to make the trials of this life bearable. But besides offering hope, they also contain an imperative: attitudes for which we should strive in this life – for example, we should hunger and thirst for righteousness, and become peacemakers. These attitudes are in deep contrast to the values of the world. Above all, the Beatitudes guide believers towards holiness and true joy in Christ.

Diocesan notices

Scam emails

The diocesan ICT team report a rise in scam emails targeting parishioners. These emails impersonate the parish priest, often using a similar email name and masking the real email address. They typically request the recipient to purchase Amazon or other gift cards as gifts for the priest.

If you encounter these emails, please report them as spam and inform the Parish Office immediately. In particular:

- never purchase gift cards as gifts for – or requested by – a member of the Parish Pastoral Team;
- double-check any suspicious emails (contact the Parish Office if in any doubt); and
- do not share personal or financial information in response to unsolicited emails.

Safe Spaces

Safe Spaces is a free and independent support service that provides a confidential, personal, and safe space for anyone who has been abused by someone in the Church or as a result of their relationship with the Church of England, the Catholic Church in England and Wales, or the Church in Wales. 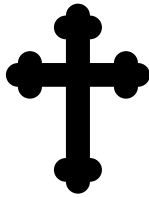
