Today's Mass

First Reading (Isaiah 58:6–10): If we, as the Church, engage in what we nowadays would term social justice – an important theme in the Old Testament prophets – then we will enable God's saving grace to be available to those who need it.

Psalm 112(111) echoes that if the good or just person puts God's virtues into practice, he or she will be a light in the darkness.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 2:1–5): It seems that the Corinthians did not think highly of Paul's speaking abilities, but Paul makes a virtue out of it: he says that we should not rely on human philosophy, but on God's power.

Today's **Gospel** (Matthew 5:13–16) is part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, and its sayings about salt and light follow on from the Beatitudes. Although Jesus says 'you are', these are really commands: this is what Christian disciples should be like. We should also note that 'you' is plural: it is the community, the Church, which is called to be salt and light. Salt brings out the existing taste of food – but if the Church becomes corrupt or conforms completely to the secular world and fails to bring Christ's teachings to the world, it is useless. Likewise, the Church itself is not the light, but the lamp which enables Christ, who is the light of the world, to be seen.

Day for Victims of Trafficking

On the memorial day of St Josephine Bakhita, the Patron Saint of victims of human trafficking, we remember and pray for the 50 million victims of this evil trade in human beings.

With as many as 50 million victims of human trafficking around the world, we call on all states to re-prioritise efforts to end this evil market in humans, as they pledged to do with Sustainable Development Goal 8.7 in 2015. This will require increased funding of the appropriate state agencies, and increased collaboration between state actors, police, civil society and business.

If you suspect human trafficking but are unsure whether to act, remember that reporting your concerns can make a critical difference. Look for signs of exploitation, such as individuals appearing fearful, isolated, or controlled by others. Call the police on 999, or Crimestoppers at 0800 555 111, to report the crime anonymously.


