Today's Mass

First Reading (Sirach 15:15–20): We have free will, but God does not want us to sin. We can choose to keep the commandments faithfully.

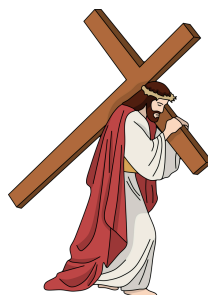
Psalms 119(118): Following God's law is the only thing which can bring happiness, but to do that requires God's help.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 2:6–10): Paul cleverly uses the Corinthians' own philosophical vocabulary against them: they are claiming to be 'spiritual', but in fact are not. The true wisdom of the Spirit is quite beyond ordinary human knowledge and language.

The sayings in today's **Gospel** (Matthew 5:17–37) are only found in Matthew – although Jesus' claim to be fulfilling the Law and the prophets rather than abolishing them and His criticism of the scribes and Pharisees are common enough. The first point is that we cannot reject the Old Testament: it is part of our salvation history, and Christ does not make sense without it. So the Ten Commandments, for example, are still in force; we cannot replace them with a vague, hippy-style appeal to love. Secondly, Jesus has some hard things to say about anger, lust, divorce, and oaths. There will be few of us who can measure our own lives against these commandments and not be provoked to go to Confession, to acknowledge our shortfalls!

This Wednesday is the first day of Lent, and a day of obligatory fasting and abstinence.

- Fasting (for those aged 18 to 59) means eating one full meal and two smaller collations that do not equate to a full meal, and avoiding snacks.
- Abstinence (for those aged 14 and above) means not eating meat, including soups and gravies made from meat. It is also good to abstain from things like alcohol on this day.

Lent begins this Ash Wednesday

Lent is the principal season of penance. As the People of God, we are called to make this season a period of special penitential observance.

Please take a Lent 2026 leaflet from the back of the church. As well as information about our Lenten devotions, it contains a useful checklist for your Lenten discipline.

Ash Wednesday has an obligation of fasting and abstinence. For the other weekdays of Lent, the Bishops strongly recommend participation in daily Mass, as well as other devotions such as Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Rosary, and Stations of the Cross.

Lent is the time when we should make a special effort to deepen our practice of the Faith. The time now commences for fulfilling the precept of Easter Communion. Let us also in this season witness to our love and imitation of Christ by our good deeds, such as visiting the sick.

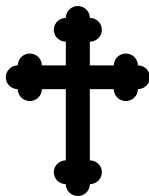
