LIVING STONES

As we look ahead to our parish's 150th anniversary next year, Sacred Heart Wimbledon is beginning an important new chapter: **LIVING STONES**. The vision of this fundraising campaign and collective effort is to preserve our church and our heritage – strengthening the life and faith of our community and ensuring that Sacred Heart remains what it has always been: a place of living worship, welcome, service, and mission for generations to come.

Today's Mass

First Reading (Ezekiel 33:7–9): God, speaking through Ezekiel, says that the appointed leader must speak out against evil. In the end, it is a matter of (eternal) life and (eternal) death.

Psalms 95(94) recalls the disobedience of the ancestors ('Meribah' means 'strife' and 'Massah' means 'testing'). Instead, we must obey God ('listen to his voice').

Second Reading (Romans 13:8–10): Love is the fulfilling of the law. St Paul lists the very sins about which Jesus speaks in the Gospel.

Gospel (Matthew 18:15–20): Christ here speaks forthrightly about the effect of unrepented sin on the community of faith. We tend to think of sin – and therefore forgiveness as well – as personal. But every sin badly wounds the whole community, the Church. The ultimate sanction against a sinner is exclusion (being treated like a pagan or tax collector).

7.00pm Wednesday: Fire Marshal Training

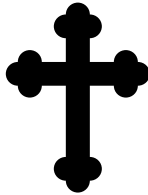
