The Holy Spirit: The true source of real inspiration

There are many sources and types of inspiration. People get inspired listening to music, actively relaxing, praying and/or reading the Holy Bible or inspired works. Essentially, the source informs the quality of the inspiration. Some inspirations can be surreal, inebriating, energising, fantastic and sometimes confusing as the experience of the Tower of Babel illustrates. (cf. Gen. 11). We are encouraged to test every spirit. 'Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God' (cf. 1]n. 4:1)

However, there is one true source of real inspiration. It is the One that teaches you everything and reminds you of all. This is the Holy Spirit. In the words of our Blessed Lord, ...the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you' (In 14:26). Often, the product of such inspirations stands the test of time. It changes lives, situations and circumstances, making them better. It is the Spirit of courage, truth, peace, unity, love. Contrary to the experience of Babel, this Spirit ensures true understanding '... and everybody is able to understand in their own native language'. (cf. Acts 2:8)

This Spirit is available to all who ask. God gives freely and willingly of his Spirit to those who ask. Jesus himself says, ... how much more will your Heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him'. (Lk11:13) This is the Spirit that gives life. This same Spirit is alive and active. God's Spirit is in us, lives among us, works within us. The Spirit of God is the true source of real inspiration. The Holy Spirit whispers words of wisdom that can clear our confusions. The Holy Spirit can encourage us to love again when we have been disappointed. The Holy Spirit will help us to trust again inspite of betrayals. The Spirit helps us to learn how to insist on living peacefully with ourselves and in our families. The Holy Spirit can help us to transform our lives and our world. It became possible for the apostles from the day of Pentecost. This day can be our own Pentecost! May the Holy Spirit truly inspire us to really live out our Christianity to the full. In this way, we are able to 'bear united witness as children of God, heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory'. (cf. Rms. 8:16,17).

PRAYER FOR THE YEAR OF MERCY

Lord Jesus, send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind. Amen
