

# Indifference: Sure and Silent Killer!

History shows that Christianity not only survives but thrives under persecution. 'The blood of martyrs is the seed of the Church' is a saying attributed to Tertullian, a 2nd-century Church Father. This statement remains a testimony to how Christianity thrived under the inglorious era of terrible persecutions of the Church under the various pagan Emperors. Indifference seems to be the new name of modern day persecution. It is more subtle. It is more deadly. Many describe it as a sure and silent killer.

The readings this weekend invite us to reflect on the need to start working for our salvation and for that of



others. There should not be an idle Christian. 'Woe to those ensconced so snugly... to those who feel safe...lying on ivory beds...' (Amos 6:1, 4). The 2nd reading therefore admonishes to, 'fight the good fight of the faith and win for yourself the eternal life...' (ITim 6:12). In inter-

preting this Sunday's gospel, someone points out that, 'it was not what the rich man did...but what he did not do that got him into hell'. Whether it is ignoring our religious duties and/or civil responsibilities, neglecting our obligations towards God and our neighbours, indifference from the point of view of doing nothing is dangerous. Irrelevance invites disaster. Our Blessed Lord gives us an example when he says, 'My Father goes on working, so do l'. (Jn. 5:17). These words of St. Paul are relevant: 'I put it to you the duty of doing all that you have been told, with no faults or failures, until the Appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ...' (1Tim 6:14).

#### PRAYER FOR THE YEAR OF MERCY

Lord Jesus, send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor,

proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind. Amen
