"What a Day!"

"What a Day". You can imagine the Apostles on that fist Pentecost day evening, throwing themselves into the armchairs, shattered by the events of the day and saying with a sigh, "What a day". Never in their lives had they experienced a day like this. It had started off as usual with them meeting up in the upper room for their time of prayer and reflection which always followed their shared breakfast. Mary and some of the other women would often call in and join them for prayer. Today it was just Mary,



mother lesus' who joined them. It was while they were all gathered together praying that they had been floored by the experience of the coming of the Holy Spirit among them. They had felt a strong wind blow through the room and on their heads stood fingers of flame. This sense of burning seemed to fill their bodies, it was a

sense of wonder, of hope, of enthusiasm that filled each of them. They were impelled to go to the balcony and, led by Peter, they began to proclaim to any who would listen about the saving acts of lesus Christ. It was Peter who spoke on behalf of them all, and who moved so many that would become believers. Here was the gift promised by Jesus at his Ascension into heaven, here was the Advocate. Now the spreading of the Good News would Indeed start. the apostles were entitled to say, "What a Day".
