SECOND COLLECTION

Today, Sunday 9 July, is Sea Sunday. The second collection that day is in support of the Apostleship of the Sea. AoS is a Catholic charity supporting seafarers worldwide and relies wholly on voluntary contributions. They provide practical and pastoral care to all seafarers, regardless of nationality, belief or race. Port chaplains and volunteer ship visitors welcome seafarers, offer welfare services and advice, practical help, care and friendship. 90% of world trade is transported by ship. However the life of a modern seafarer can be dangerous and lonely, they may spend up to a year at a time away from home, separated from their family and loved ones and often working in harsh conditions.

The National Board of Catholic Women is actively seeking to promote the presence, participation and responsibilities of Catholic Women in the Church and society.
